

'Meh' is like.....

In the video Kyle talks about feeling 'meh', and that when we feel 'meh' it can feel **like** we're walking in mud. Now we're not really walking in mud, it's that word **like**, that makes the statement a **simile**.

Similes are statements when something is compared to something else and the two somethings would usually have nothing to do with each other. For example, feeling 'meh' and walking in mud. Sometimes the word **like** might be replaced with the word **as**, for example, "My hands are **as** cold as ice." My hands are being compared with ice.

To help you understand and describe how feeling 'meh' (blah, drained, or flat) feels, you're going to write a simile poem using the format below. Remember the last time you felt 'meh' and create similes using your five senses. Your similes don't just have to be one word, you might want have a bit more detail in your description.

Metaphor: Remember a simile is where something is being compared with something else and will have the word **like** or **as** in the statement. A metaphor, on the other hand, says that something **is/are** something else. For example, "My hands are ice." My hands are not really ice, but it helps paint a picture of my hands being very cold.
